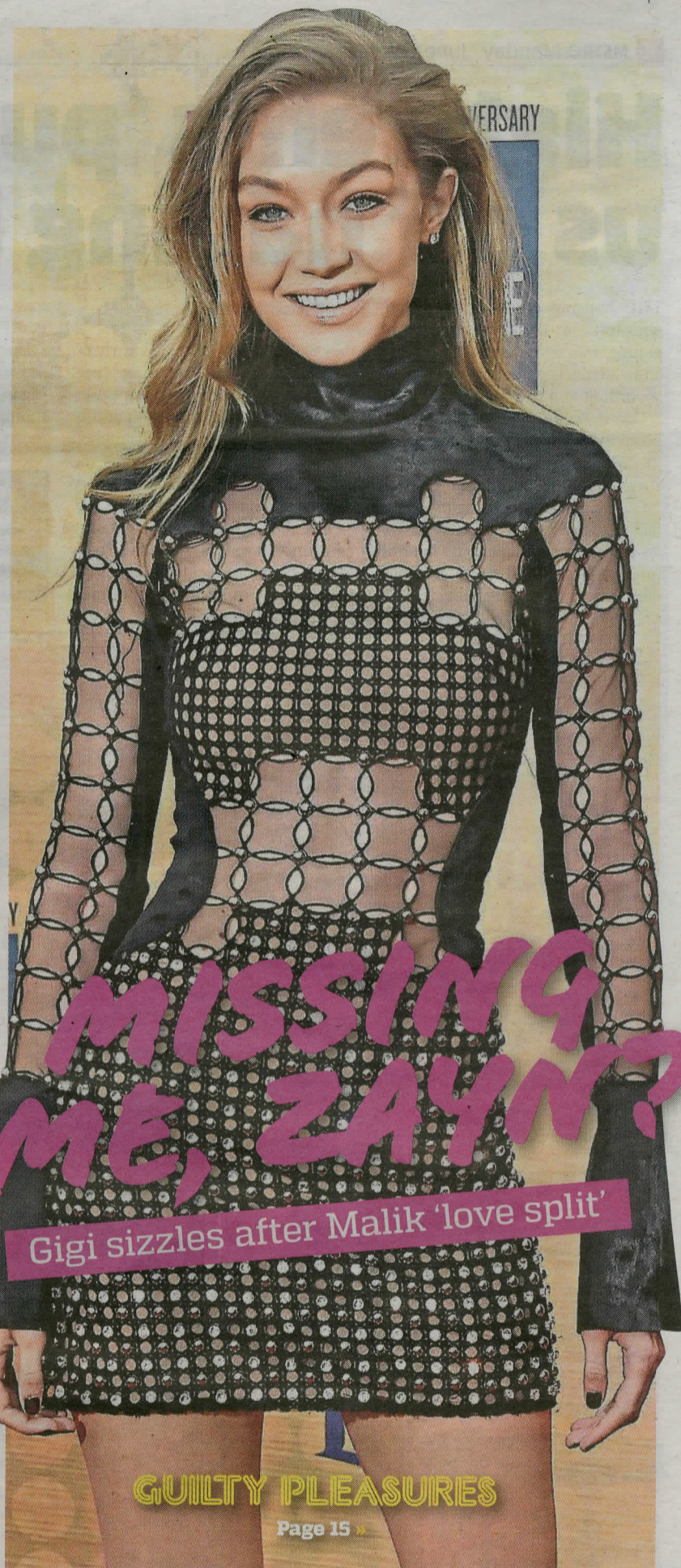

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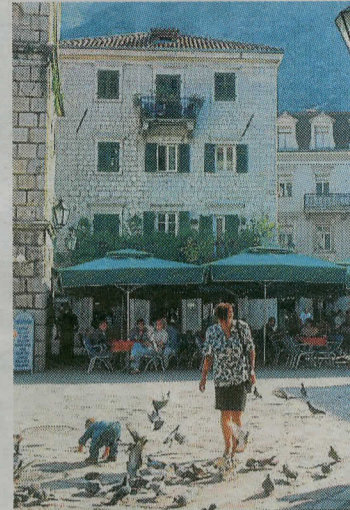

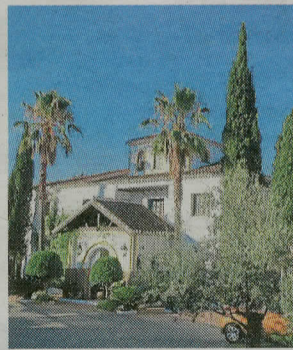

Upside down in Andalucia

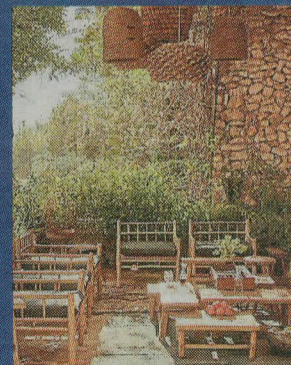

Where it is always wine o'clock

BORDEAUX'S homage to its wine industry, the £63m Cité du Vin museum, opened last week on the banks of the Garonne. The aluminium-panelled 'Guggenheim to wine' is designed by Parisian architects XTU who have created a 55m tower that is inspired by wine swirling in a glass. Its 20 themed areas trace the history of wine and include a simulator boat ride of a merchant galley ship and a 'chair of despair' that provides audios of famous inebriates and their hangovers. The museum's top two floors contain a panoramic wine saloon, a restaurant and a huge boutique that sells an impressive 800 wines: 200 from France and 600 from the rest of the world. £14, laciteduvin.com
